The following commercial specification is originally adopted from the military documents. Revision A includes all known accepted revisions, amendments, notices, and Department of Defense (DOD) engineering changes previously developed for this item.

Note: Although many military quality and inspection specifications, drawings and standards have been discontinued or deleted, most have been replaced by industry and commercial documents. When the specification refers to a discontinued or deleted document, you should refer to the procurement document or your contracting officer for guidance.

WEBBING, TEXTILE, ELASTIC

The Parachute Industry Association makes this document available for use by Industry and Government organizations that wish to apply this specification to their products.

1. SCOPE

1.1 Scope. This specification covers requirements for elastic webbings used in aviator and ground combat clothing and equipment.

1.2 Classification. The webbing shall be furnished in the following types as specified (see 6.2). The classes and widths shall be as specified (see 6.2) and as indicated in Table I.

Type I — Cotton fiber

Type II — Nylon fiber

2. APPLICABLE DOCUMENTS

2.1 Government documents

2.1.1 Specifications and standards. The following specifications and standards form a part of this specification to the extent specified herein. Unless otherwise specified, the issues of these documents shall be those listed in the issue of the Department of Defense Index of Specification; and Standards (DODISS) and supplement thereto, cited in the solicitation.

2.1.2 Other Government documents. The following other Government document forms a part of this specification to the extent specified herein. Unless otherwise specified, the issue shall be that in effect on the date of the solicitation.

(Copies of specifications, standards, and other Government documents required by contractors in connection with specific acquisition functions should be obtained from the contracting activity or as directed by the contracting activity.)

2.2 Other publications. The following document forms a part of this specification to the extent specified herein. Unless otherwise specified, the issue of the documents which are DOD adopted shall be those listed in the issue of the DODISS specified in the solicitation. Unless otherwise specified, the issue of documents not listed in the DODISS shall be the issue of the nongovernment document which is current on the date of the solicitation.

AMERICAN SOCIETY FOR TESTING AND MATERIALS (ASTM)

2.3 Order of precedence. In the event of a conflict between the text of this specification and the references cited herein (except for associated detail specifications, specification sheets or MS standards), the text of this specification shall take precedence. Nothing in this specification, however, shall supersede applicable laws and regulations unless a specific exemption has been obtained.

3. REQUIREMENTS

3.1 First article. When specified in the contract or purchase order, a sample shall be subjected to first article inspection (see 4.4 and 6.3).
